This class is designed for new carvers.

Russ will walk the new carver through the various stages of carving from selecting the best wood to which tools to use including Fordom's, micro motors, burners and painting as well as the various techniques for all of the skills required for wildlife carving. This class is designed for small numbers with lots of one on one training.

REQUIRED TOOLS: STUDENTS ARE REQUIRED TO BRING A POWER GRINDER I.E. fordom or a dremel with a flex shaft, some coarse bits and some fine bits. A sharp carving knife, a pr. of calipers, a flexible ruler or straight edge, a mechanical pencil, an assortment of paint brushes #1,2,3. Dust masks and safety glasses are recommended. Some tool can be rented from the AWCA for new carvers not sure where to start.





Library News

Besides the quarterly Wildfowl Carving Magazine our club receives, two new books(listed below) have come into the Library this year that may be of interest for those of you working on carving projects at home or thinking of a project to try.

Workbench Projects Patterns and Color Guides by Jean Minaudier-provides information, patterns and color guides for 30 different birds plus a carving demonstration for a wood duck hen. The birds include an American Avocet, American Black Duck, American Kestrel, American Robin, American White Pelican, Arctic Tern, Atlantic Puffin, Barn Owl, Magpie, Blackburnian Warbler, Cinnamon Teal Drake, Cliff Swallow, Common Goldeneye Drake, Double Crested Cormorant, Golden Crowned Kinglet, Great Grey Owl, Harlequin Drake, Least Sandpiper, Lesser Scaup Drake, Mallard Drake, Northern Mockingbird, Peregrine Falcon, Red-Headed Woodpecker, Ring Necked Pheasant, Sharp Shinned Hawk, Snowy Owl, Surf Scoter Drake, Tundra Swan, Whip-poor- will and Yellow Warbler.

Work Bench Projects Half-Size Great Horned Owl by Keith Muellerprovides a pattern, detailed description of the feather layout as well as the location of the eyes on the owl. It also provides a step by step description of carving the owl as well as a step by step description of painting. It is an excellent book for carving a project on your own.
