A Message from Cheryl Hepperle

I have been asked to be the Community Relations Director for AWCA and as such, to get the ball rolling, I have been in contact with Samantha of Cabela's as well as Bob Parsons for the annual Snow Goose Chase. We have supported both of these organizations for the past several years and will continue as long as we have sufficient volunteers. These events help our club with free advertising, a venue to display our work and allow us to sell raffle tickets as a fundraiser. For the newer members, our club provides a small display of our carvings, talk to the public about our group and where we meet, what we do and how to be a member. In addition we have a great time.

Cabela's Spring Great Outdoors Event is their annual spring sale. Cabela's bring in clubs and vendors to help promote the store and attract customers and we are one of the clubs that are invited to these events.

Cabela's Ladies Day Out is a day where Ladies are treated to a variety of experiences like, shooting a gun/bow, or learning to back up a trailer and many other events that Cabela's organizes twice per year. Our club teaches and helps participants to carve and paint a feather. Glen, Wayne and others cut out the feather blanks and do some initial carving to prepare for the event and could use volunteers for that process as well as during the event day on May 7th. **The Snow Goose Chase** is an event where they take underprivileged kids out to the lakes to show them the thousands of geese and other birds that migrate through the Tofield area each spring. If you have not been to one of these events the mood is very upbeat and the enthusiasm of the kids is infectious. Some of the kids have never been on a bus, let alone outside of their own neighborhood or the city.

We are provided with a light lunch and drinks during our time at these events.

With the annual Images of Nature Show approaching quickly, members are encouraged to support our show by volunteering to help and by entering their finished wildlife art pieces. Carvers are reminded that competitions like our Images of Nature Show provide opportunities to have their carvings assessed by a panel of judges. This assessment and feedback is invaluable to carvers at all levels wishing to improve their skills. The Alberta Wildlife Carving Association sponsors two (2) purchase awards with an additional third purchase award sponsored by Cabela's. They include:

- \$1,000.00 for the best decorative life-size Songbird, or decorative Raptor (min 6" to 14: max)
- o \$750.00 for the best Land or Sea Mammal, decorative or slick with suitable habitat
- \$500 for the best North American Shorebird, decorative or slick (gunning style on a stick acceptable)

This year's Carving in the Park Summer School will be held once again at the Red Barn in Sherwood Park: July 5th through July 10th 2016. The following courses are available:




The surface is finely burned with an obtusely honed burning tip. This style of tip will burn very finely but not very deep. It is also easier to control than an acutely honed tip.

2016 Basket Weaving- Edmonton Course Description July 5 to 10, 2016

These courses are designed for you to learn and create, while having fun. Three one and a half day basket weaving classes will happen over the six days of the school. Using various widths of reed, students will learn basket weaving techniques to create and finish up to three baskets. They will choose from a variety of natural and hand-dyed reeds, as well as yarn to incorporate their own color choices during the weaving.

Beth Crabb- Weaving Biography

Beth started weaving in 1991 at Crete Nebraska, and learned willow weaving in Sask. She is largely self-taught, and enjoys creating her own designs. Her work in watercolor and clay influence the development of her weavings. Beth enjoys teaching basketry, and sharing her passion for weaving and her love of creating functional works of art. Her baskets have been exhibited in Moose Jaw at Yvette Moore's Gallery, Creative Photo graphics, the Moose Jaw Museum and Art Gallery, and Lumsden's Letterbox Gallery. In 2007 she was selected as one of three artists to represent Moose Jaw in Ottawa on July 1, to celebrate Moose Jaw as one of the Cultural Capitals of Canada. In 2011 Beth was juried into the Sask. Craft Council. Her weavings are in collections across Canada.

<u>First Basket - Tall two for-one Basket:</u> <u>July 5th full day and July 6th AM.</u> Interesting project creates two handy baskets on a tall "D" frame. They can either sit on a surface, or be hung on a wall. You may incorporate decorative techniques, dyed reed, yarn and seagrass to create your unique baskets. Finished measurements for the baskets are approximately 4" x 6" x 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " and 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 6" x 3".



Second Basket - Williamsburg Basket: July 7th full day and July 8th AM. This beautiful and sturdy basket starts with a square 7" over/under base, and grows to 12" across and about 9 ½" high. You may use plain weave with a variety of colours and textures, or vary that with a section of twill weave. The unique shape of the Williamsburg handle guides your weaving to create a basket to complement any room.



Third basket - Nesting Baskets: July 9th, and July 10th AM. In this class you will weave as many of the nesting baskets as time permits, in your choice of the sizes (likely two). The bases are formed with twining, and the walls are created with twill weaving in your choice of colours. They are excellent baskets for serving bread or crackers, or displaying treasures. They vary in size from 4 1/2" to $8\frac{1}{2}$ " across the rim.
