In Memory of Al Price (1935 - 2015)

It is with deep regret that we announce the passing of Alan Price, carver, friend, wildlife photographer, long term Board of Directors member and Past President of the Alberta Wildlife Carving Association. Al passed away on Thursday Aug. 20 after a long illness. Al was a true carver who enjoyed all types of carving including relief carving, bark carving, animal carving, and bird carving and was especially fond of carving marine mammals. Al enjoyed organizing and leading and after joining the club he quickly became a member of the AWCA Board of Directors and then President. Al always had a ready smile and quick wit and loved a good debate. His vast experience in business brought solid thinking to daily matters of the club and a clear view to long term planning; his ability to sell an idea made him a valuable leader. In his later years Al had some difficulty carving and decided to take up wildlife photography which became a passion. Although he was not a regular at carving he continued to stop by classes, shows and our summer school to see how things were going. His personality was such that many of us would be asked "How's Al Price doing?" when we visited shows and schools across Western Canada. We will always think of Al fondly and be looking for him to drop by to see how we and the AWCA are doing.
